

# Dress-Up Practice: “ly”

You can make sentences more interesting by adding an “ly” word to them!

Practice this “ly” dress-up by adding one to each sentence, below. First, look at my example –

Scout **hissed** when Eli walked into the kitchen.

Scout **hissed** cruelly when Eli walked into the kitchen.

An “ly” word tells HOW something happened. How did Scout hiss? She hissed cruelly!

An “ly” word can come before or after the action word in a sentence. (Action words are called “verbs”.)

Below, the action words are in **bold**; rewrite the sentence on your own paper and put an “ly” word before or after the action word:

1. A black spider **crawled** across my lap!
2. Sam **shot** the target with his new BB gun.
3. Wind **blew** a Douglas fir tree across our driveway!
4. Snow **drifted** around Grandpa’s garden.
5. Randy **skied** down the mountain.
